2020 Application of Interest

Aspire Kiwi Youth Development is again asking for new and existing applications of interest. Some sites will also be interested in a small fund that can be offered as grants to support the running of the program. This is the result of a number of fundraising initiatives, none more than the generosity of Warehouse Stationary. This year we are seeking applications for funding of full, camp or resource support only. There is a limited pool of funds and we would encourage you to take advantage of the local marketing resources we have developed to help you access local financial support from both corporate or private sponsors. Even if you are not seeking funds but wish to use the framework and resources we would appreciate you completing an application of interest by ticking 'resource support' so we can ensure a quality standard and share resources.

Aspire Funding Options:

Full Funding: \$9,000 support the full cost of 35-week developmental program, staffing and adventure camp.

Facilitator Funding: \$6,000 supports the funding to facilitate the course for the 40-week program without funding for the adventure camp. (any site may choose to access alternative funding for the adventure or propose an alternative).

Adventure Camp Funding: \$3,000 funds the adventure component only

Resource Support: for sites wanting to run the Aspire content without the need for financial support.

Expectations of an Aspire Site:

1. Timely communication to Project Coordinator if variation from ASPIRE project outline, including:
 - a. Numbers consistently drop below 8
 - b. Any incident before, during & after programme
 - c. Challenges delivering on Community Projects, Adventure Experience, Family Support, Graduation or Evaluation.
2. Complete paperwork according to project manual
3. Participate in bi-monthly connects via internet.
4. The Corps or Centre to have at least two 'Connect Events' where families of ASPIRE participants are invited to, to make attempts for families to be linked into Corps or Centre support.
5. Ensure regular supervision of ASPIRE facilitators, providing support & ensuring good practice
6. Aspire facilitators to be police vetted and Keeping Children Safe Trained (training can be provided) & completed relevant H/R processes if employed

Territorial ASPIRE steering group commit to:

- 1. Equipping through training, provision of programme curriculum, and policies.
- 2. Pastoral support of facilitators if required
- 3. Available for problem solving when challenges arrive
- 4. Keep Corps & Facilitators of any developments that will support ASPIRE outcomes
- 5. Provide finance in timely manner – journal as negotiated
